



BREAKING NEWS: Lancaster Office Challenged to "Bring It" for Second Annual School Supply Drive

LANCASTER, Pa. - Accounting firm Reinsel Kuntz Leshner's Lancaster office is holding its second annual **School Supply Drive** contest this August. The collection period **starts Monday, August 3** and **ends Friday, August 14**, at which time the floor with the most school supplies collected will win a prize and bragging rights for another year.
